## NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This arrangement of the ever-familiar "Taps" was inspired by a ceremony that was held at Arlington National Cemetery in May of 2012. The occasion marked the 150th anniversary of "Taps" and featured approximately 150 buglers as embled together to pay tribute to the piece, first in a mass playing of the tune, and then at moon by dispersing into all parts of the cemetery and playing individual renditions of this hallowed melody. The effect of this was very moving and in some ways mysterious. The melody echoed throughout the vast space of Arlington so the listener heard the bugles that were close and the ones that were far away some in different keys all contributing to the tapestry of sound.

A Celebration of Taps is an attempt to capture the effect of this ceremony in this new arrangement. In your performance, some of the trumpets may be positioned off-stage or at various points in the hall to enhance the echo effect.
